### The Collect

Grant, O merciful God, that your Church, being gathered together in unity by your Holy Spirit, may show forth your power among all peoples, to the glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

### The Old Testament

#### Isaiah 58:9b-14

If you remove the yoke from among you, the pointing of the finger, the speaking of evil, if you offer your food to the hungry and satisfy the needs of the afflicted, then your light shall rise in the darkness and your gloom be like the noonday. The Lord will guide you continually, and satisfy your needs in parched places, and make your bones strong; and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters never fail. Your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in. If you refrain from trampling the sabbath, from pursuing your own interests on my holy day; if you call the sabbath a delight and the holy day of the Lord honorable; if you honor it, not going your own ways, serving your own interests,

or pursuing your own affairs; then you shall take delight in the Lord, and I will make you ride upon the heights of the earth; I will feed you with the heritage of your ancestor Jacob, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.

### The Psalm

#### Psalm 103:1-8

- 1 Bless the LORD, O my soul, \* and all that is within me, bless his holy Name.
- 2 Bless the LORD, O my soul, \* and forget not all his benefits.
- 3 He forgives all your sins \* and heals all your infirmities;
- 4 He redeems your life from the grave \* and crowns you with mercy and loving-kindness;
- 5 He satisfies you with good things, \* and your youth is renewed like an eagle's.
- 6 The LORD executes righteousness \* and judgment for all who are oppressed.
- 7 He made his ways known to Moses \* and his works to the children of Israel.
- 8 The LORD is full of compassion and mercy, \* slow to anger and of great kindness.

# The Epistle

#### Hebrews 12:18-29

You have not come to something that can be touched, a blazing fire, and darkness, and gloom, and a tempest, and the sound of a trumpet, and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that not another word be spoken to them. (For they could not endure the order that was given, "If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned to death." Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear.") But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel. See that you do not refuse the one who is speaking; for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we reject the one who warns from heaven! At that time his voice shook the earth; but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heaven." This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of what is shaken—that is, created things—so that what cannot be shaken may remain. Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us give thanks, by which we offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe; for indeed our God is a consuming fire.

# The Gospel

#### Luke 13:10-17

Now Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. And just then there appeared a woman with a spirit that had crippled her for eighteen years. She was bent over and was quite unable to stand up straight. When Jesus saw her, he called her over and said, "Woman, you are set free from your ailment." When he laid his hands on her, immediately she stood up straight and began praising God. But the leader of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had cured on the sabbath, kept saying to the crowd, "There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be cured, and not on the sabbath day." But the Lord answered him and said, "You hypocrites! Does not each of you on the sabbath untie his ox or his donkey from the manger, and lead it away to give it water? And ought not this woman, a daughter of Abraham whom Satan bound for eighteen long years, be set free from this bondage on the sabbath day?" When he said this, all his opponents were put to shame; and the entire crowd was rejoicing at all the wonderful things that he was doing.

**Status of the Church:** There is a current motion before the Diocesan Standing Committee for their August 20 meeting to close Good Samaritan. The Bishop's Committee met with Standing Committee President, Gerry Madison, and member Rev. Moki Hino on August 6 to discuss the mission and ministry of Good Samaritan Church. It was also to discern how we functioned as a church and what we saw as our purpose now and in the future. After meeting with us, a follow-up email from Gerry to the Bishop and members of the Task Force that did a review of Good Samaritan conveyed the conclusion of both the Rev. Hino and Gerry that Good Samaritan retain the status of Mission since they find no justification on Canonical or missional grounds to degrade, dissolve, or otherwise make a change at this time. They do recommend continued oversight and a vision/mission/purpose plan from us. Thank you to those who sent in ideas that were included in a draft that was submitted to the Standing Committee. We pray that the Standing Committee will go along with Rev. Hino and Gerry's recommendation to allow us to continue as a mission.

**Priest-with-Oversight:** Kahu Irene will continue to be our Priest-with-Oversight as we go through the process of restructuring ourselves as a mission.
