**REMINDERS:**

**Update on Jan Motoshige: Final Chemotherapy Treatment - Hooray!**

Yesterday, October 30, mom had her 12th and (hopefully) last chemotherapy treatment. Hooray!

She said her good-byes and expressed her gratitude to the chemo nurses and, after her treatment, they presented her with a “Partnership for Survival” pin and the entire chemo nurse team congratulated her with a round of applause. It was very touching and heartfelt.

Next week she will meet with the surgeon and most likely her surgery will be scheduled sometime in mid to late November. The chemotherapy did shrink the tumor but at this point we do not know if she will get a lumpectomy or mastectomy.

After the surgery, if cancer cells are still detected, the oncologist shared that he might recommend a second chemotherapy treatment, however, it would be a chemotherapy in pill form. The oncologist does not think mom can tolerate a second cycle of chemotherapy treatment via IV so she will be removing her chemo port soon.

We are looking forward to having mom free of the nausea so she can gain back some strength. These past 12 weeks did wipe her out and she is quite unsteady and wobbly. We are hopeful her side effects (numbness, hair loss, nausea, short-term memory loss) will dissipate over time.

Mahalo for your care and concern. I will keep you posted throughout November.

The webinar will run from 10:00 AM-12:00 Noon. Parmer led workshops on Kaua'i and O'ahu last August on practices of evangelism, hospitality, and belonging. But how do we implement these practices during a pandemic? Parmer will discuss launching IWC during a pandemic and address your questions and concerns. **A Reminder on Phishing Scams:** Online scams are here to stay and we need to remain vigilant. The Diocesan Support Center continues to receive messages about questionable emails from the Bishop, and also from their own clergy. It's always good to double-check if you are not sure after taking some precautionary steps. Here are a few reminders to help identify whether an email is legit:

- Check the return email address. If the address doesn't match the name of the sender, that's a red flag. (Some emails may use similar addresses to legit ones - check closely.)
- Look for grammatical or spelling errors in the text of the email.
- Never open attachments from unknown sources, especially those with an ".exe" extension that could launch an unwelcome virus or malware onto your device
- Check the address at the bottom of the email. If it says "Pastor Tom" and Tom never goes by "Pastor," it's fake.

Finally, if the email appears safe and the sender is asking for money, goods or personal data, contact the person directly to verify.
