The Collect

The following Collect is being used in commemorations of Queen Lili'uokalani:

E Ke Akua Mana Loa, ke ho'omaika'i nei mākou i Kou Inoa no Ka Mō'ī Wahine 'o Lili'uokalani, nāna i kupa'a mau iho, oiai 'o ia ma loko o ka pilikia nui, i ka maluhia, ke kala'ia'ana, a me ka hana mana 'ana iā 'Oe. E ho'āpono mai, ke pule nei mākou, i ko mākou mahalo no kona ho'omanawai, kona ha'awina ma ke mele, a me kona aloha i kāna po'e. Ke nonoi nei mākou i kēia mau mea ā pau ma ka inoa o Kāu Keiki, 'o Iesu Kristo. 'Āmene.

Almighty God, we praise your Name for Queen Lili'uokalani, who in the midst of great adversity remained steadfast in her commitment to peace, forgiveness and of service to you. Accept, we pray, our gratitude for her perseverance, her gift of

song, and her love for her people. All this we ask in the name of your Son Jesus Christ. Amen.

Old Testament

Daniel 12:1-3

The Lord spoke to Daniel in a vision and said, "At that time Michael, the great prince, the protector of your people, shall arise. There shall be a time of anguish, such as has never occurred since nations first came into existence. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. Those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars forever and ever."

The Epistle

Hebrews 10:11-14, 19-25

Every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, “he sat down at the right hand of God,” and since then has been waiting “until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet.” For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified. Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

The Gospel

Mark 13:1-8

As Jesus came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, “Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!” Then Jesus asked him, “Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down.”

When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, “Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?” Then Jesus began to say to them, “Beware that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name and say, ‘I am he!’ and they will lead many astray. When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birthpangs.”

Queen Lili'uokalani

Today throughout our Diocese, we commemorate Queen Lili'uokalani's death, how timely that we sing the Queen's Prayer once again. Composed by Her Majesty on March 22, 1895, while she was under house arrest at Iolani Palace. This hymn was dedicated to Victoria Ka'iulani, heir apparent to the throne. In September 1895, eight months after the Queen's arrest and imprisonment at Iolani Palace, she was paroled and returned to her home, Washington Place, where she remained under house arrest. Bishop and Mrs. Willis of St. Andrew's Cathedral were among the first to call on Her Majesty to offer sympathy and support. They visited often. Later Bishop Willis invited her to become a member of the Anglican Church and on May 18, 1896, she was baptized and confirmed at St. Andrew's Cathedral where she remained an active member for the rest of her life.

Dial 808 To Make Local Calls

Just a reminder that since October 24, 2021, all local calls, including those on the same island, will require you to dial area code 808 + telephone number. The change comes as the Federal Communication Commission (FCC) adopts 988 as a new three-digit number to be used nationwide to reach the National Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Crisis Lifeline starting July 6, 2022. In order for it to work, all service providers must implement mandatory 10-digit local dialing. Be sure to update all your contacts with their area codes.
